The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith, and the resolution promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, is on file with Township Clerk and available for inspection.

Section 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances, inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect after final adoption and publication as required by law.

CFO TALKED ABOUT YEAR 2024 BUDGET

Alex Davidson, Chief Financial Officer, stated that tonight we are introducing the annual 2024 budget. The 2024 budget is increasing approximately \$400,000.00 from last year. The municipal tax burden is only going up .76 percent, or \$18.00 annual or \$1.50 per month for the average accessed resident. We were able to keep the budget lean in spite of the cost of inflation along with the cost of goods and services going up.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Township of Berlin that in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.6a &b and based upon the Chief Financial Officers certification, the governing body has found the budget has met the following requirements:

- a. Payment of interest and debt redemption charges
- b. Deferred charges and statutory expenditures
- c. Cash deficit of preceding year
- d. Reserve of uncollected taxes
- e. Other reserves and non-disbursement items
- f. Any inclusions of amounts required for school purposes
- 2. That the provisions relating to limitation on increases of appropriations pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.2 and appropriations for exceptions to limits on appropriations found at 40A:4-45.3 et seq. are fully met (Complies with the "CAP" law.)
- 3. That the budget is in such form, arrangement, and content as required by the Local Budget Law and N.J.A.C. 5:30-4 and 5:30-5.
- 4. That pursuant to the Local Budget Law:
- a. All estimates of revenue are reasonable, accurate, and correctly stated,
- b. Items of appropriation are properly set forth,
- c. In itemization, form, arrangement, and content the budget will permit the exercise of the comptroller function within the municipality.
- 5. The budget and associated amendments have been introduced, publicly advertised, and in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Budget Law, except that failure to meet the deadlines of N.J.S.A. 40A:4-5 shall not prevent such certification.
- 6. That all other applicable statutory requirements have been fulfilled.
